

a chance to win the Middlesex League Freedom Division title on Thursday morning, extra motivation for both sides as they close out their seasons.

More important to the Warriors is their chance to extend the winning streak on Thanksgiving to three games.

"We're just playing for ourselves, for that three-peat to keep the Thanksgiving trophy," said senior captain OL/DL Joe LaMonica. "We're going for the positives that we get out of it. For our entire families, it's just a better mood on Thanksgiving when you win."

"Nothing can be closer to the truth," agreed Wakefield head coach John Rafferty, leading his 5th Thanksgiving game as the head coach at his alma mater after playing in it and then later coaching as an assistant for Melrose. "When you're in this game, and I've been in it for far too many years, it is still the most important game throughout the course of the season. So yes, you have your good Thanksgiving's and sometimes not so good."

That can certainly qualify as a theme for the 2023 Warriors who have dealt with plenty of adversity in the form of injuries this season, most notably to senior captain WR/DB Steven Woish, the team's lone returning All-Star from last year's perfect season. Woish (16 catches, 311 yards, 4 TDs) and freshman QB Westin McNeilly (469 passing yards, 6 TDs) had the Warrior offense buzzing to start the year 3-0 with wins over Greater Lawrence, Lexington and Northeast Metro Tech. Injuries to both were a significant reason why the Warriors went 2-3 in their next five, including losses to strong

a chance to win the Middlesex Burlington (21-0), Woburn (36-3) League Freedom Division title and Stoneham (22-6) teams.

Although McNeilly will need to wait until next year to experience his first Thanksgiving game, Woish is back and the Warriors have been finding their groove again, picking up two shutouts in a row in the consolation round, 21-0 over Medford on Nov. 2 and 36-0 over Lynn Classical the following week.

"A bunch of inexperienced players have had to step up," said senior captain OL/LB/K Mark Letchford. "We played a few tough games when we weren't healthy but now we're starting to get everyone back."

The revamped playbook for Wakefield is run-heavy, leaning on LaMonica, Letchford and a talented offensive line for new tight-end-turned-quarterback, junior Matt Beaver.

Running well behind that power has been sophomore RB Myles Sanchez who has racked up a team-high 1,011 rushing yards and 13 TD's. The new thunder to the starting RB's lightning has belonged to freshman Jaden Fullerton who earned 358 rushing yards and 3 TD's in the final six games, steadily climbing the depth chart from a special teams standout to a key part of the offense and the defense as a linebacker.

Standing out even more has been the defense as a unit. Their second straight shutout now means the Warriors have allowed under 10 points per game on the season. Their front seven of LaMonica, Letchford, Beaver, Fullerton, juniors Jackson Fitzpatrick and Zach Courtright a big reason for that, in addition to Sanchez senior Declan O'Callahan and juniors John Fitzgerald

and Ian Christie in the backfield.

Together, the Warriors will look to disrupt a Melrose offense that has averaged 28.4 points per game this season, led by dual-threat QB Connor Brophy, not far removed from a nearly 300-yard, 4TD performance against Wilmington on Oct. 27.

"The quarterback is a throwing threat but more importantly a running threat, he's off the charts as far as that goes, so he adds a special dynamic to the offense," said Rafferty of Brophy. "They're just a good, solid high school football team. They do everything well. They're extremely well-coached and as a result, they execute well."

Meanwhile, Wakefield's recent success is a credit to the seniors who have refused to let a playoff absence define them.

"The team chemistry aspect has helped us out a lot because we're all friends not only on the field but off it too," said LaMonica. "If you can't find a reason in yourself why you want to win then do it for someone else."

It's a feature of this team that Rafferty saw before the season was even close to starting.

"One thing I've noticed about this group and this is going back to last winter with offseason workouts, they're a tight-knight group," said the coach. "They just have great attitudes. They truly understand that any suc-





cess is a collective effort and they're special that way and as a result, they're great to coach."

That mentality has carried over from last year's 13-0 Super Bowl season. Many of these Warriors played key roles on that team, experience that can only help in the biggest game of this season.

"Last year, we played a lot of huge games so there won't be as much pressure on us because we've been in those situations," said Letchford.

"On Thanksgiving, there's al-

ways a great turnout, no matter the situation so we're ready. I mean, it doesn't get crazier than walking into Gillette Stadium so I don't think the hype factor should really get to us," said La-Monica.

Says Rafferty, "They made it to the mountaintop so they've experienced that and everything about it. It doesn't get any more excitable or a bigger atmosphere than that. For us this year, it's Thanksgiving. They know what it's like to play in big games."

"Even last year, when we

thought we could go there and win easily - just knowing it's a grind every year helps," agreed Woish.

Warrior football alum like Rafferty can understand the mindset of the seniors as they look forward to their last high school football game on their home field.

No matter your motivation, it's reason enough to leave it all out there.

"In football, you work all week for one game," said LaMonica. "Other sports, you lose, 'Oh well, we'll get 'em on Thursday.' In football, you work so much, watch so much film, practice so much all for one game so it's our last opportunity for all of that work to pay off."

For others, the chance to deny their rivals the league trophy is at the top of the motivating food chain.

"It's always nice playing spoiler to your rivals when you get a chance to take the league title from them so it gives me an extra pump to go out there and bring it," said Woish, a sentiment no doubt understood by those lucky enough to play on Thanksgiving. "We definitely don't want our rivals to win the league if we can say something about it."

And finally, for others, well hey, it's Thanksgiving after all. Let's not forget what's really important.

"Just looking forward to leaving it all out there, going home and eating some good food," says Letchford.

In the end, Wakefield has continued their "one-game at a time" mantra in order to prepare for the 113th meeting between the two.

"I know I'm a bit of a broken record when I say we just focus on the next game but we have," said Rafferty. "We're focused on Thanksgiving, that's everything to us right now. It's always a big deal for the kids, particularly the seniors and it would be the cover of the book for this group. They want to go out on a high note and be remembered for that."
